If you live in the areas, you may be eligible to apply through PIN-LIHEAP. Please contact the Social Services at 817-3165 for more information.

Please take notice of the following LIHEAP documents in this flyer that are needed to apply for your heating needs. **Due to problem that we have encountered, we will NOT be able to “front” any deliveries for you, nor will we be able to make promissory calls to your vendor on your behalf.**

While filling out your LIHEAP application, please, be prepared to tell your intake worker how you will want your benefits split. **Benefits will not change after you have been certified.**

A household that is responsible for paying its electricity and has been found eligible for LIHEAP **may** also qualify for additional benefits through Emera Maine. This process is separate from LIHEAP but the application will be done at this time so you will need to provide a copy of your most recent electrical bill.

HOUSING ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The following housing assistance is available. For more information about these programs please contact the Housing Department at (207) 817-7370.

Emergency Rental Assistance:

Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) is a program offered by the Housing Department. This program is a last resort, which will provide assistance to help low-income Penobscot Tribal members in the acquisition and retention of affordable housing. The maximum one-time only amount is \$800.00 which can be utilized for a security deposit or rent. All applicants are required to complete a 'stabilization plan,' showing the steps necessary to retain housing.

Emergency Repairs:

If you are experiencing a housing emergency, the Tribal Emergency Rep program is available through the Housing Department. Typically, the program can help with an electrical, plumbing, or heating emergency. To some extent the program can also help fix problems that have turned into emergencies, such as: a leaking roof, a broken window, or the need to address safety issues as a result of domestic violence. This program was designed to help low income home owners with emergencies that are: 1) of recent origin-problems that have developed over time are generally not emergencies, 2) resulting in a condition that threatens health and safety, and 3) situations where the homeowner has no other resources to address the problem. Applicants must be low income to qualify. If you are interested in finding out more information about this program please contact the Housing Department at (207) 817-7370.

Closing Cost:

Up to \$4000 is available to assist tribal member purchase a home. The program requires that the applicant provide evidence from a bank or other lender that they are approved for borrowing. At the time of closing, the program will pay for any closing costs up to \$4000.

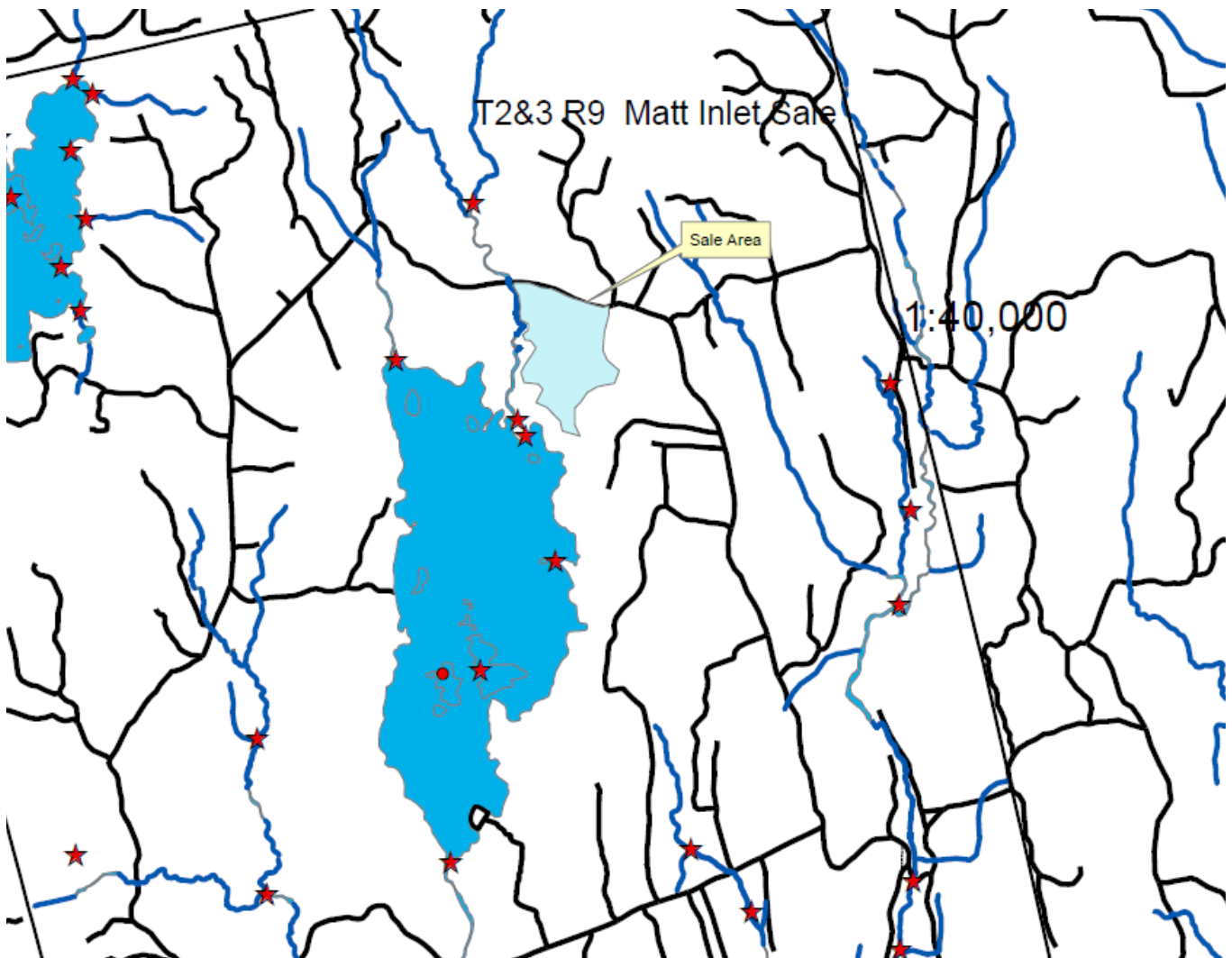

Four Directions is excited to assist tribal members who are interested in the following services:

1. FDDC offers the following loan products: Home Loans, Home Improvement Loans, and Small Business Loans.
2. FDDC is excited to now offer \$5,000 down payment assistance grants for qualified low-income home buyers (low income: 80% or below of the current median household income). Qualified home buyers will need to provide a letter demonstrating that they have been approved for a home loan with a mortgage lender.
3. Credit Builder Loan Program – This program offers tribal members the opportunity to work with a Four Directions financial counselor to repair or build their credit history, with credit builder loans available up to \$3,000.
4. Four Directions can assist and refer interested tribal members to community agencies that offer the Matched Savings Family Development Account (FDA). Income qualified participants will meet with a counselor to establish a goal to save money, over a period of time, in a savings account that will be matched at 4 to 1, once the goal has been met. For example, if a participant establishes and reaches a goal of saving \$1000 toward the purchase of a car, they will be matched with another \$4000 for a total of \$5000. FDA goals can include: vehicle purchase, vehicle repair, buying a home, repairing a home, and paying for emergencies, and can be set for up to \$1000.
5. FDDC offers free housing and financial counseling, as well as free tax preparation assistance during the tax season.
6. FDDC offers tribal artists the opportunity to list and sell their products online through the www.wabanakimarketplace.com website.
