You have completed your own autobiography, for now. You have explored how you make an impact in our world through who you are, where you have been and where you plan to go in your life. Now you will study another person who has made an impact on Maine. You have chosen a person to research. The people we are researching are men and women, members of Penobscot nation and non-members of Penobscot nation, from the past and present, famous and not so famous. What all these people share in common is that they are people who make a difference in the world because of who they are and where they have been.

You will research your person and answer several specific questions about them. When your research is done, be prepared to share your study with a partner. You will look for things your people have in common and how they are different. As a class, we will mark where these people make an impact on our Worldview Circle chart as well.

Your final page will be published in a collection of biographies about Maine people that make an impact. This collection will be kept in the library for other students to use.
